- 5. PAG's Areawide Water Quality Plan (208 Plan) - Progress Update**

Mead Mier, PAG Sustainability Coordinator, will introduce the theme of today's meeting, in the context of new information relevant to PAG's 208 Plan update. She will present the results of modernizing the point source inventory chapter of the 208. An interactive map and database are now available through a web portal to ease access, allow for updates to the data and speed the ADEQ consistency review process.

- 6. Arizona's Recycled Water – where are we and where are we going**

Dave Dunaway, ADEQ Groundwater Protection and Water Reuse Value Streams Manager, will provide a brief overview of the rule changes that went into effect on Jan. 1 and describe an outline of future potential rule changes regarding recycled water in Arizona.

## **7. Emerging Contaminants in Wastewater: Local Best Practices**

Dan Quintanar, Tucson Water, and Jeff Prevatt, Pima County Wastewater Reclamation, will address the impact of emerging contaminants such as pharmaceuticals in our regional wastewater. The presentation will describe how Dispose-a-Med raises awareness with community groups about proper disposal of pharmaceuticals to protect people, pets, wildlife and the environment.

## **8. PAG's Planning Efforts for Treatment and Prevention of Non-Point Source (NPS) Pollutants**

Ms. Mier will present on the progress of PAG's ADEQ 604b grant. The report will include recommendations for programs and projects to address E. coli standard exceedances. GIS is being used to identify areas suitable for green infrastructure to treat E. Coli. In addition, new partnerships are being pursued for pollution prevention outreach about dog waste. The top NPS pollutant issues and recommended actions will be included in PAG's 208 Plan update.
